To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

whereas, Gabriel L. Fender of Elkhart County Indiana
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Wayne
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Gabriel L. Fender
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the East half of the South East quarter of section twenty eight, in Township Thirty seven,
 of Range five, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Wayne Indiana,
 containing Eighty Acres

according to the official plan of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said Gabriel L. Fender

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several
 acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Gabriel L. Fender
 and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To
 Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging; unto the said Gabriel
 L. Fender and to his heirs and assigns forever.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto
 affixed.
