To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Hiram Langdon, of Clarke County, State of Ohio,
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte,
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Hiram Langdon
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the East Half of the North West quarter of Section Twelve in Township Thirtieth seven north, of Orange Five, West of the
Second Meridian, in the District of Lands subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing eighty acres,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Hiram Langdon.

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Hiram Langdon
and to his heirs, the said tract above described:
To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said
Hiram Langdon
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
