To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Edwin Dyer in his own right and as assignee of Richard Brinston Hews has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at San Jose, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Richard Brinston Hews and Edwin Dyer according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the West half of the North East quarter of Section fourteen, in Township Thirtysix North of Range five, West of the Second Meridian, in the District of lands subject to sale at San Jose, originally containing eighty acres according to the official plan of the survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Richard Brinston Hews and Edwin Dyer

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said **Edwin Dyer**

and to his heirs, the said tract above described:

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said **Edwin Dyer** and to his heirs and assigns forever.
