in the District of Land subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing eighty acres, and seventy three hundred forty four
acres,
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-

Nancy Agnew
and to her heirs and assigns forever.
