To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Elihu Chittenden, Assignee of Henry King and of Thomas Bidle who was a assignee of said King has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Salle where it appears that full payment has been made by the said Henry King according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the first East quarter of Section twenty eight, in Township Thirty five North of Range five West, in the District of Lakes, subject to suit at La Salle, Indiana, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Henry King.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Elihu Chittenden and to his heirs, the said tract above described.

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Elihu Chittenden and to his heirs and assigns forever,
