To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas William Clark of La Porte County Indiana
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William Clark
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the
 North half of the North West quarter of Section one, in Township Thirty-four, North of Range six West, in the District
 of Land, subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing sixty-eight acres and fifty-one hundredths of an acre,
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said William Clark.

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said William
 Clark

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
 William Clark, and to his heirs the said tract above described:

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
