To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Joshua Robert Calaway Brown of La Porte County Indiana  
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte  
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Joshua Robert Calaway Brown  
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the  
North half of the North East quarter of Section four, in Township Thirty five, north of Range six West in  
the District of Larned, subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana, containing seventy one acres and eleven hundred  
and three quarters of an acre,  
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-  
chased by the said Joshua Robert Calaway Brown

**NOW KNOW YE,** That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the  
several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Joshua Robert  
Calaway Brown  
and to his heirs, the said tract above described:  
To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said  
Joshua Robert Calaway Brown  
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
