Whereas Jacob Wolf, Senior, of La Porte County, Indiana  
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at La Porte  
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Jacob Wolf, Senior  
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 25th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" for  
 the North West quarter of Section Thirteen, Township thirty six North, of Range six West, in  
 the District of lands subject to sale at La Porte, Indiana; containing one hundred and sixty  
 seven acres and nine hundredths of an acre  
 according to the official plan of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-  
 chased by the said Jacob Wolf, Senior

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the  
 several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Jacob  
 Wolf, Senior

and to his heirs the said tract above described:  
 To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said  
 Jacob Wolf, Senior
