To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Benjamin Saylor Aftignee of John Taylor, of LaPorte County, Indiana,
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at LaPorte
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John Taylor
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 2d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the East half of the south West quarter of section thirty three, in Township thirty five North, of
Range six West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at LaPorte, Indiana, containing Eighty
Acres.
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said John Taylor

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Benjamin Saylor
and to his — heirs, the said tract above described:

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
Benjamin Saylor and to his heirs and assigns forever.
