and to their heirs, the said tract above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights,
privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Chauncy

Buckler Blair and Jeremiah Atkins

and to their heirs and assigns forever.
