To all whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 26917 for 80 acres in favor of Stephen Howell  
*Private Captain Johnston's Company Pennsylvania Militia  
 War 1812.*

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the lots Numbered Five and Six, being the South half of the South West quarter North of the Indian Boundary Line, of Section Liberty five in Township Thirty Seven North of Range Seven west in the District of Lands Subject to sale at Indianapolis Indiana containing Eighty Acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said warrant having been assigned by the said Stephen Howell to John S. S. Hunter in whose favor said tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said John S. S. Hunter as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John S. S. Hunter as assignee as aforesaid and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
