To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. *27693* for *40* acres, issued in favor of *Henry Mack, Private Captain Williams' Company, New Jersey (Micha) Mar 1812*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *North East quarter of the North West quarter of Section Twelve, in Township Thirty Three, of Range Seven West, in the District of Land Subject to the Claims of the Miamia Indians containing Fifty Acres*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *Which said warrant has been by said Henry Mack duly assigned to Charles E. De Wolfe.*

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Charles E. De Wolfe,*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Charles E. De Wolfe, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *Melland Fillmore* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
