To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. *40.389* for *40* acres, issued in favor of *Oliver Kingsbury Private & Captain West Company fifth Regiment Connecticut Militia Mar 1812*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *South East quarter of the North East quarter of Section Eleven in Township Thirty Three, of Range Seven West, in the District of Kansas, Subject to Sale at Menomac Indian Containing Forty acres*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *which said warrant has been by said Oliver Kingsbury duly assigned to Charles E De Wolfe,*

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Charles E De Wolfe,*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Charles E De Wolfe, and heirs*

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *Millard Fillmore* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
