To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting :

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 19343 for 40 acres, issued in favor of James Utley Private in Captain Barrow's Company New York Militia Mar 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the North East quarter of the South West quarter of Section Six in Township Thirty four of Range Six West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Winamac Indiana containing Forty Acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL :

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said James Utley

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said James Utley and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
