Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 15,347 for 80 acres, issued in favor of *Peggy Harper widow of James Harper Deceased, Lieutenant in Captain Mann's Company, Ohio Militia War of 1812*

*East Half of the North West quarter of Section Twenty Six in Township Thirty-Five of Range Seven West in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at Winamac Indiana, Containing Eighty acres*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *George C. Closser*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *George C. Closser and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
