To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 14913 for 80 acres, issued in favor of *William Cox Private in Captain Pryor's Company Ohio Militia* War of 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *West half of the South East quarter of section eleven in Township thirty three, of Range five west, in the District of Lands Subject to sale at Wiamac Indians containing eighty acres*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *Which has been recognized to Mark G Reeves and James Pullard*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Mark G Reeves and James Pullard*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Mark G Reeves and James Pullard and to their*

heirs and assigns forever.
