Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 76,339 for 40 acres, issued in favor of *Reuben Murphy Private in Captain Whitmore's Company South Carolina Militia Mar of 1812*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section One in Township Thirtly three of Range Seven in the District of Lands subject to sale at Vincennes Indiana containing Forty two acres and Forty seven hundredths of an acre*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *Which has been signed to Charles E De Wolfe*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Charles E De Wolfe*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Charles E De Wolfe and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
