KNOW YE, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847,

*Alfred W. Rose, Sergeant in Captain Smith's, Com-  
pany 1<sup>st</sup> Regiment Illinois Volunteers,*

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in *his* favor numbered

*11,244*


THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto *the said Alfred W. Rose* the South West quarter of Section fifteen, in Town-  
*ship thirty three North of Range five West, in the District*  
*of lands subject to Sale at Winamac Indiana, con-  
taining one hundred and sixty acres.*

according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract *has* been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned War-  
rant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND  
TO HOLD the said *quarter* section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said

*Alfred W. Rose, and to his,*

heirs and assigns forever.
