To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Know Ye, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847.

*Joseph Coleman, father and heir at law of Hardy Coleman, deceased, private in Captain Hamilton's Company, Twelfth Regiment United States Infantry*

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in *his* favor, numbered

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto *Ezekiel Morrison, assignee of said Joseph Coleman, and to his heirs, the North half of the North West quarter of Section one, and the North half of the North East quarter of Section two, in Township thirty three, of Range seven, West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Winau-mac, Indiana, containing one hundred and fifty nine acres, and three hundredths of an acre*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tracts have been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *parts of said* sections of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said

*Ezekiel Morrison, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
