Know Ye, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847.

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in his favor, numbered 52 257

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto John B. Vail assignee of said Matilda Campbell, and to his heirs, the West half of the North West quarter of Section Thirty one, in Township Thirty four, of Range Four West, and the East half of the North East quarter of Section Thirty six, in Township Thirty four, of Range Five West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Winamac, Indiana, containing one hundred and sixty two acres, and sixteen hundredths of an acre


according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tracts have been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said parts of said sections of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John B. Vail, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
